



### Review

WHITEFIELD AODS (PADOS House, June) – With nationwide commemorations around the First World War Centenary, Whitefield AODS's latest production was a particularly appropriate one. The Accrington Pals looks at the young men of Lancashire who enlisted in response to Kitchener's call for a volunteer army, forming a battalion with a distinctly local identity. Groups of friends and neighbours joined up together, many excited by the prospect of war, but the Accrington Pals suffered devastating losses in the opening day of the Battle of the Somme, and the community bore its own devastation, with almost everyone at home affected by the death or wounding of a relative or friend.

As seen in Whitefield AODS's production however, Peter Whelan's play focuses more on the Accrington Gals, the wives, girlfriends and family of those who headed off to war. We meet May, a strong businesswoman, who seizes the opportunity of war to expand her greengrocery business. Her lodger and friend Eva finds work at the mill, while another local girl, Bertha, is employed on the tram and – shockingly for the time – shortens her skirt a good 12 inches above her boots to enable her to carry out her duties. Annie is left to cope with her errant boy Reggie, while Sarah takes the war in her stride, always happy to drown anyone's sorrows with a drink.

Each of the women has a love story of sorts. Lorraine Cox as May showed considerable talent, the character's initial coldness softening throughout the play as she reveals her fondness for her cousin Tom (Jack Forrest), 10 years her junior and a socialist dreamer. Eva. played beautifully by Charlotte Ashworth, bids farewell to her lover Ralph (Sean Howarth), while Annie (Jenny Gregson) is driven mad by the loss of her god-fearing husband Arthur (Leon McKenna) and young Reggie (Connor O'Brien in a notable debut for the company) is left to look after her. Sarah (Elisabeth Burgon) and Bertha (Emma Toms) balance each other well, the former begrudgingly wishing for the return of her husband, and the latter ashamed to accept a proposal from a co-worker unable to enlist through illness.

After a dramatic battlefield scene, it is left to CSM Rivers (Keith McEvoy), the officer who promised to look after the Pals, to deliver the final tragic news to May, as the other women march on the town hall to find out the truth, none of them believing the pro-war propaganda being printed in the newspapers. And life must then go on for those left behind, with another two years of war ahead.

The intimate surroundings of the PADOS theatre allowed the characters to reach out to the audience and share their emotions. A simple set, where a wheeled cart rotated to become a fireplace, and projections of streets, interiors or trenches established each scene, worked well, and final images of poppies in the field and the Accrington Pals memorial left a poignant reminder of the sacrifices made 100 years ago.

### **GOING VIRAL: THE POWER OF SOCIAL MEDIA**

On Tuesday 27 May my wife came home from Asda with some wearable England flags for the kids. I tried one on looked in the mirror and noticed that when the hood was up it looked a bit like a Klu Klux Klan cloak. A photo was taken of me and I uploaded it to Facebook & Twitter saying that they looked a bit wrong. A few friends retweeted it on Twitter and some liked it on Facebook and I thought nothing more about it.

On Thursday morning I noticed my phone going crazy so I checked and I found had just over 100 retweets. My previous record was 50 so it was a bit of a surprise. On my lunch I checked again and it had passed the 1,000 mark and went up another 200 in the next 30 minutes. I was messaged by Milton Keynes community news asking if they could use the photograph.

Things then started to snowball out of control. The Sun rang my mobile for an interview, Sky TV contacted me and my retweets passed the 5,000 mark by Friday lunchtime. In the end almost every major daily newspaper and every local newspaper carried the story. I totally lost control of the photograph. There were stories in papers with my photograph credited to other people and other Twitter accounts were using my photographs as their own. Some of these Twitter accounts I couldn't even name drop in this publication. I have to admit this point I did start to have some concerns. The photograph did reference a controversial subject. It wouldn't have been too difficult for it to be taken out of context and I could end up in an awkward situation.

The story on the Telegraph website had nearly 500 comments on it. One comment even said the pictures on my wall were terrible. They were pictures drawn by the kids at school! I stopped reading the comments then.

Even now over a week later I am still getting

lots of retweets and including around 200 today, Friday 6 June, leaving a current total of 7,752.

The moral of the story is be careful what you upload on the internet. What you think is a funny picture to send round your mates can quite easily end up with your face on Sky News. I'm off now to work out how to get 1,000's of retweets on demand and move into a career in marketing!

### **Book Review**

### How Eskimos Keep Their Babies Warm - Mei-Ling Hopgood

Parenting is a funny business. Everyone has an opinion on how to do things, from potty training to bedtimes - and that is only friends and family. Imagine how many different views on these everyday aspects of a child's life exist across the world...




Mei-Ling Hopgood's fascinating book explores a range of ideas from across the globe, looking at how 'normal' practice in one culture may seem unusual, if not downright odd, in another. Hopgood writes from the parent's perspective, and the book is part social history and part memoir as she tries to apply different strategies with her own daughter.

Whilst some of the issues here are familiar to many, from newspaper headlines and popular studies, others are genuinely new and absorbing to the reader. We all know that the French have a reputation for appreciating good food, and Hopgood's exploration of mealtimes at a French nursery school serve to explain how children come to see food as more than just fuel. However, the ways in which Japanese children are encouraged to work conflicts out for themselves, even if that means coming to blows, and the reality of how and why Kenyan parents manage without pushchairs, are small revelations which lead us to wonder about how we perceive growing up.

Hopgood's style is a mixture of anecdote, example and research, meaning that the book is always readable and is educational in the best of ways - you find out an awful lot, and you don't always realise how much you are learning. Not a bad way of thinking about teaching children, either...

### The Jolley-Rogers and the Ghostly Galleon - Jonny Duddle

Jonny Duddle's picture books have quickly become modern children's classics, and this chapter book follows on from 'The Pirates Next Door', using familiar characters but offering a longer and



more detailed read for that awkward age when picture books are dismissed as 'babyish' but longer books are still a little too challenging.

Duddle's illustrations are carefully spaced, so that there are no daunting pages of solid text: there is always at least one line drawing to pull us in. However, the text also does this brilliantly. Picking up the story from where it was left at the end of 'The Pirates Next Door', it begins with strange happenings in Dull-On-Sea. Firstly there are some very odd night-time visitors. Then the museum is robbed - and whilst the account of events offered by hapless security guard Arthur Poppycock is garbled, it makes one thing clear: there are pirates involved! Matilda thinks it must be time to contact her best friend Jim-Lad, and he and his family soon set sail for Dull-On-Sea to try to discover exactly what is going on...

Short enough for a rainy afternoon read, or long enough to keep younger readers guessing through a week of bedtimes, this is a fabulous little book.





#### For the Base:

150g Chocolate Digestive biscuits 50g Butter or margarine

50g of brown sugar

Handful of Maltesers

### For the filling:

400g of full fat cream cheese 200g of Double or whipped cream 100g of icing sugar 1tsp vanilla extract

200g Dulche de leche or ready made caramel 100-150g Malteser's

Using a large freezer bag and a rolling pin break up the Maltesers and biscuits into a fine crumb.

Top the cheesecake with malteser's and serve with a swirl of chocolate sauce for extra indulgence.



### Maximus flora phobia - true or just a tall story?

I'm not quite sure whether or not this is an officially registered phobia, but it seems to be one I see people suffering from frequently, so I thought I'd invent a Latin name for it. Maximus (large) flora (plants) phobia, creeps up on people slowly and its more common than you may think.

Maybe it's not as serious as Botanophobia, the official phobia for people who have a genuine phobia of plants, but this pseudo-phobia is specifically related to selected members of the plant kingdom which grow taller than humans. I first discovered this was an issue when I planted a Rowan tree in my back garden at the age of 18. "How big will that grow?" my mum would ask me every spring, and each year I would reply with my standard answer "oh, not much bigger than that!"

I'm not sure if it's the fact that humans are generally control freaks and like to be able to reach the top of the plants (for maintenance I can only presume), if they feel over whelmed by the sheer size of a large tree, or perhaps are overly concerned about it growing too near to the house.

There are ways to manage the growth of large trees and plants, such as pollarding (cutting off the branches to leave a trunk with a stumpy top), or 'balling up' as it's known in the industry (the act of trimming shrubs into spheres). In my opinion both are hard work, and generally leave ghastly looking results, with the exception of topiary of course!

A much better idea is to select the correct tree or shrub in the first place. If you have a border just 2 feet wide, plant a small shrub such as a Hebe that only wants to grow to 2 feet wide. A little research should throw up some good varieties. Trees such as Amelanchier 'Robin Hill' and Acer griseum, or Sorbus 'Joseph Rock' are ideal. Try



Prunus 'Amanogawa' for a flowering cherry, or Crataegus persimilis 'Prunifolia' which will grow in any location and any reasonable soil.

If you're a plant-nut like me, then it will probably frustrate you when people over trim plants to within an inch of their lives, or hack bits off trees, making them look like alien forms. If you live with a 'sufferer' and as a last resort, you could try introducing a pause in your words, as a good friend of mine did when asked how large the Eucalyptus in the front garden would grow .... "Oh, only four-t-five feet darling'. She actually got away with that one ... until the following summer that is anyway!

Enjoy your garden.

Most groups are organised geographically, but there are some that specialise in shorter, easier, or family-friendly walks, and others that cater for specific age groups - for example people in their 20s, 30s or 40s. Walks are run weekly and are generally led by a trained leader. The cost of annual membership is £32 or £3 per month.

The British Walking Federation organises walking events for people of all ages and abilities, to encourage personal fitness through regular non-competitive exercise. To participate, simply turn up and register on the day. A list of events can be found on their website



www.bwf-ivv.org.uk along with a list of walking groups around the country. The British Walking Federation offers individual membership at £8 per year, which entitles members to a calendar of events, newsletters and discounts on entry fees to permanent BWF trails.

If you like walking but fancy something a little different, why not give Nordic Walking a try? Originally designed to help cross-country skiers train during the summer months, this method of walking is suitable for all ages, experience and fitness levels, and involves the use of specially designed poles to give you a full body work out that tones the arms, legs, stomach, chest and back, in addition to the legs. Using the poles puts less pressure on the joints as the work is shared between different parts of the body. The only equipment needed to start Nordic Walking is a good pair of shoes and comfortable clothing. Poles are provided within the class fee price of £5-£6 for around an hour.


